

What is BOOST?

- Tool developed by the World Bank to facilitate access and analysis of public expenditure used in over 40 countries
- Organizes budget data in a standard easy-to-use format and makes it available, with government consent, to the general public
- Draws on data taken directly from national Treasury systems
- Presents the budget classifications for the public sector in standard BOOST template: *ADMIN*, *ECON*, *FUNC*, *PROG*, among others


Analytical Applications of BOOST

- *How* are public funds spent?
 - Level and composition of expenditures
 - Budget prioritization and allocations
 - Budget deviations
 - Trends within specific expenditure categories


- How well are public funds spent?
 - Equity and targeting of expenditures
 - Efficiency of sectors or programs
 - Relative efficiency of expenditures

Where to Look for Efficiency? Monitoring Budget Deviation


Economic Classification




Comparing Apples to Apples











Stacked Column Chart: Moldova








